



Code of Behavior

1. Teachers/advisors will assume full responsibility that student members (herein called members) are present in their scheduled conference locations, wearing the assigned South Carolina TSA attire and following the TSA code of behavior at all times while attending conferences.
2. All members shall behave in a courteous manner and refrain from language and/or actions that could bring discredit upon them, their school and/or TSA. Members should wear name badges at conferences.
3. Members shall be appropriately clothed at all times
4. Members agree not to consume or have in possession any alcoholic beverages or non-prescription narcotics, gamble, smoke, or use other tobacco, vaping, or electronic smoking devices/products during the conference.
5. Conduct not conducive to an educational conference will not be tolerated. Examples of unacceptable conduct includes, but is not limited to, disrupting a businesslike atmosphere, consorting with nonconference individuals or any activities which will endanger self or others. Students should refrain from turning up loud devices such as speaker systems, gaming systems, etc. Remember to keep noise levels reasonable.
6. Members are expected to attend all general sessions. Members shall keep their advisors informed of their activities and whereabouts at all times.
7. Members shall observe curfew unless directly supervised by your advisor/chaperone.
8. Members shall refrain from all types of roughhousing including dropping articles out of the windows/balconies.
9. Members understand that girls' hotel rooms are off limits to boys and boys' rooms are off limits for girls unless an advisor is present.
10. There will be no physical contact between any members that could cause physical or emotional harm, or that could be perceived as sexual in nature.
11. Members agree to pay for all phone calls made from their rooms. These will be shown on individual bills and paid for by the local chapter or chapter members.
12. Members shall respect hotel and conference properties and will pay for any property damage or loss that occurs due to their stay during the conference. It is hoped that each member attending the conference will take this Code of Behavior with a positive attitude so that engineering & technology education in South Carolina will continue to have the respect of education, business people and the general public. Further, members and their parents understand that infractions to this code will result in advisor and principal notification, a member/chapter may be asked to leave, and in the case of legal infractions, the authorities will be notified.
